## **Close Contact Changes**

Quarantine and testing requirements for close contacts will be changing from 12.01am Saturday 30 April. Close contacts of a COVID-19 case will no longer need to quarantine. However, for 7 days after exposure they will be:

- Required to wear a mask when they leave the house
- Required to undertake five rapid antigen tests during the seven days
- Prohibited from high-risk settings (hospitals, residential aged care and disability care facilities, correctional services, and Aboriginal community-controlled organisations)
- Required to notify their employer or school / education facility

Close contacts will also be strongly encouraged to:

- Avoid contact with people at risk of severe illness
- Avoid non-essential gatherings
- Monitor themselves closely for symptoms and get a PCR test as soon as any symptoms develop

Close contacts who are quarantining with other people do not need to restart the above guidelines each time if another person in the house tests positive.
